# **Adoption FAQ**

Our goal is to adopt loving Bichons, to responsible, loving, permanent homes.

- For dogs under eight years old The Small Paws® Rescue's Adoption Fee is \$150.00. This adoption fee includes vaccinations, heartworm check, teeth cleaning (if needed) and altering (if over 6 months of age.) For dogs over eight years old the adoption fee is reduced to \$75.00.
- Bonded pairs may be adopted together for the single adoption fee outlined above.
- If shipping your new Bichon to you is required, there will be these additional fees: \$175.00 for air fare, \$40.00 for an airline approved crate, and \$35.00 for an FAA required veterinary health certificate.(The crate, health certificate and airfare are not refundable.)

They had to be sheared like little sheep then developed upper respiratory infection and are being neutered and spayed today. Noel is heartworm positive so the pups will need to stay in driving distance since Noel cannot fly while undergoing heart worm treatment. Their coats are just beginning to grow out and we will have them groomed in about 10 days then they both will be ready for foster home. Both of the pups are 1 yr and weigh about 15 lbs. each. They are a little thin due to the road they had been traveling. Truly hard to see who they are since we have their coats on them for protection and warmth. They are going to be fine looking pups once they are groomed and their coats grow out.

# Food Allergies... No goodies for you!

Since this is the time of enjoying food the good girls at Small Paws ask that I give my professional opinion regarding food allergies in dogs. In our SP group of S Texas we have had 3 dogs this year of 2013 that have had food allergies and what a difference it made when the Dr's were able to help these pups. Stain on mouth, feet and ear infections cleared.

Food allergy is the third most common cause of allergic itching and scratching in dogs. It occurs in dogs of all ages. Unlike canine atopy, food allergy is not seasonal. Dogs can develop allergies to chicken, milk, eggs, fish, beef, pork, horse meat, grains, potatoes, soy products, or dietary additives. A dog must have been exposed to the allergen one or more times to become allergic. Typically, the dog has been on the same diet for at least two years. In rescue we can see some signs within months of their arrival.

The principal sign is severe itching, sometimes accompanied by the appearance of small red bumps, pustules, and raised patches of skin. Characteristically, the rash involves the ears, feet, backs of the legs, and underside of the body. Many dogs will start by showing signs just in their ears, with a red, moist rash.

Treatment: The diagnosis is made by placing the dog on a hypoallergenic test diet and watching for a definite reduction in itching and scratching. A hypoallergenic diet is one that has a very limited number of ingredients. It should contain no added coloring, preservatives, or flavorings. Most important, it should contain ingredients that the dog is unlikely to have encountered in the past. Your veterinarian can prescribe an appropriate hypoallergenic diet after carefully reviewing the composition of the dog's current diet. Switching from one commercial food to another is not an adequate test, as these nonprescription diets contain too many ingredients and the dog is likely to have eaten some of them in the past.

The test diet usually consists of a commercial hypoallergenic prescription diet such as salmon and rice or duck and potato, available through Hill's Pet Products, Purina, and Waltham. Once a good commercial hypoallergenic diet is found, the dog can be left on that diet indefinitely. Eliminate all treats and chews, and switch from a chewable tablet heartworm preventive to one that comes in a different form.

A reduction in itching may occur within a few days of starting the test diet, but in many cases it takes several weeks. The test diet should be continued for at least 10 weeks. Once improvement is noted, various foods can be added one by one until the offending allergen is identified by noting that it causes an increase in the amount of itching and scratching.

Be sure to contact your vet if you feel your pup might have some food allergies and of course follow their instructions in caring for and treating your pup.
